Subject: Introduction of HWPL

We would like to extend our warmest congratulations on the 2026 All India Mahatma Gandhi Thought and Literature Conference and express our sincere gratitude for the opportunity to participate in this meaningful gathering. It is with great honour that HWPL introduces itself to the MGM Foundation on this occasion.

HWPL (Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light) is an international peace NGO established in Seoul, Republic of Korea in 2013, with the mission of ceasing war and achieving the restoration of world peace. As a purely civilian peace organization — not a religious body — HWPL holds Special Consultative Status with the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and is associated with the UN Department of Global Communications (DGC). It currently carries out peace activities in over 216 countries, working alongside its partner organization, the International Women's Peace Group (IWPG), and its affiliate group, the International Peace Youth Group (IPYG), in collaboration with leaders across government, religion, academia, and civil society.

In 2013, HWPL proclaimed the Declaration of World Peace, calling for a new international legal instrument to end war and bring lasting peace to the global community. On March 14, 2016, the Declaration of Peace and Cessation of War (DPCW) was proclaimed — comprising 10 articles and 38 clauses built around the prevention of conflict, the resolution of disputes, and the maintenance of sustainable peace. The DPCW has received official support from five national governments as well as major international bodies including the Pan-African Parliament (PAP) and the Coalition of Caribbean Leaders for Peace (CCLP). In April 2024, the substance of the DPCW was reflected in and adopted as a resolution of the UN Human Rights Council — a historic milestone for civilian-led peace advocacy.

HWPL is currently active across four core areas: advancing the DPCW into international law through the "Legislate Peace" Program, with 922,507 signatures secured from 178 countries; establishing Peace Academies in 572 institutions across 111 countries and signing MOUs with 1,606 organizations to embed peace education within formal curricula; facilitating interfaith dialogue through 294 WARP (World Alliance of Religions' Peace) Offices in 132 countries, engaging over 1,000 religious leaders from diverse traditions; and empowering the next generation through the IPYG network of over 1,300 youth organizations across 128 countries.

HWPL Chairman Man Hee Lee is a recipient of the Mahatma Gandhi Prize for Non-Violent Peace and has undertaken 32 World Peace Tours, forging peace agreements with governments and civil society organizations worldwide. HWPL's success in bringing an end to the 40-year conflict in Mindanao, Philippines — through a comprehensive peace package encompassing legal frameworks, interfaith reconciliation, peace education, youth engagement, and media cooperation — stands as a concrete demonstration of the real-world impact of its approach.

It is with great sincerity that HWPL looks forward to this conference as an opportunity to carry forward the spirit of Mahatma Gandhi — his enduring vision of peace through non-violence and dialogue — and to build a meaningful and lasting partnership with the MGM Foundation.
